

Bathroom Shelf

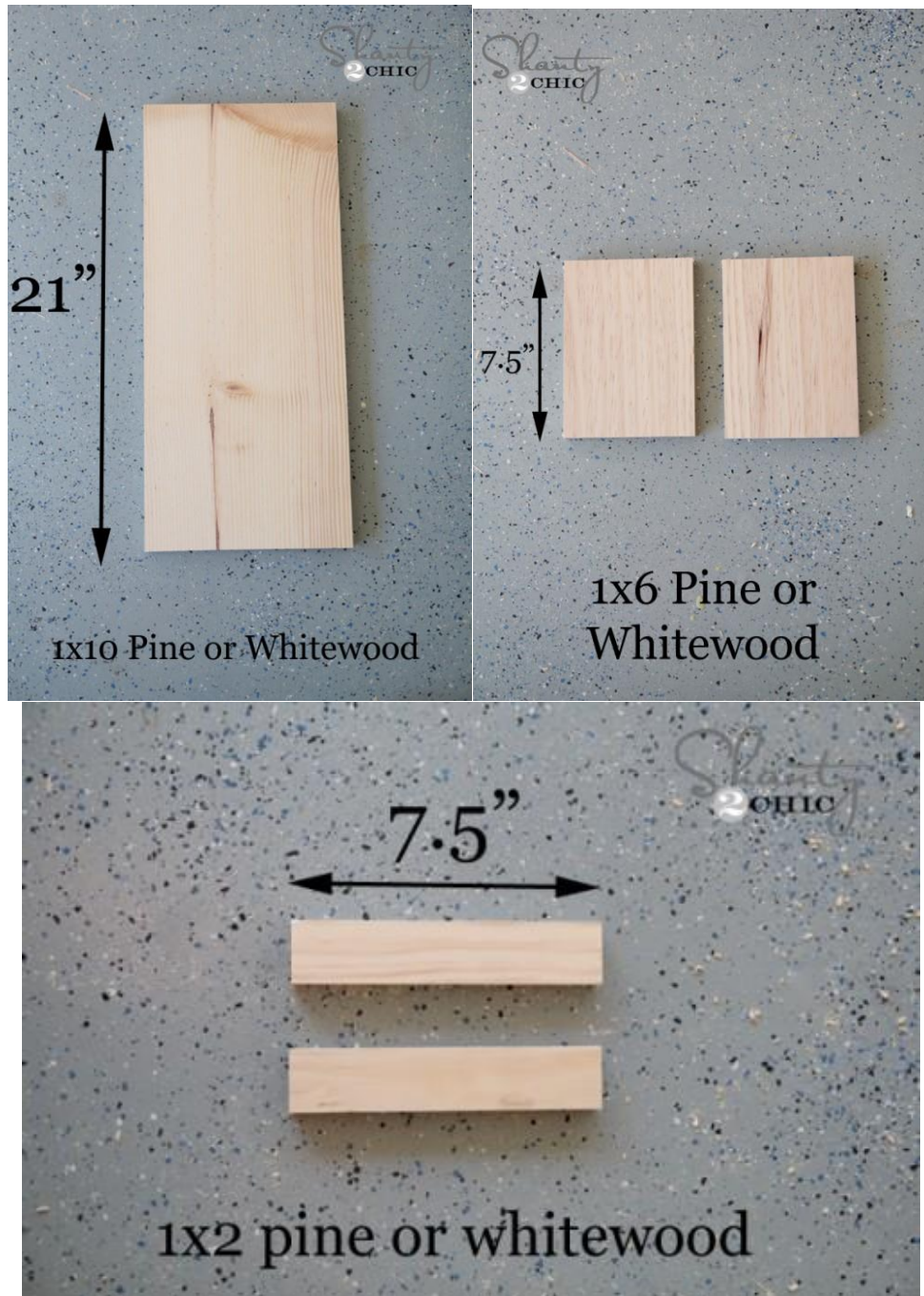


Supply List:

- 1 x 10 x 4' board
- 1 x 6 x 4' board
- 1 x 2 x 4' board
- Stain
- Metal Hooks

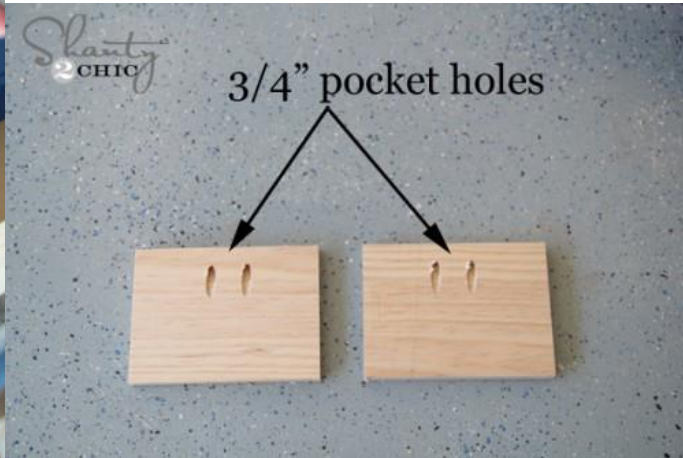
Step 1:

My first step was making my cuts. I used my Ridgid miter saw to make all my cuts. You can also use a cheap hand saw. It requires a bit more elbow grease, but totally gets the job done.



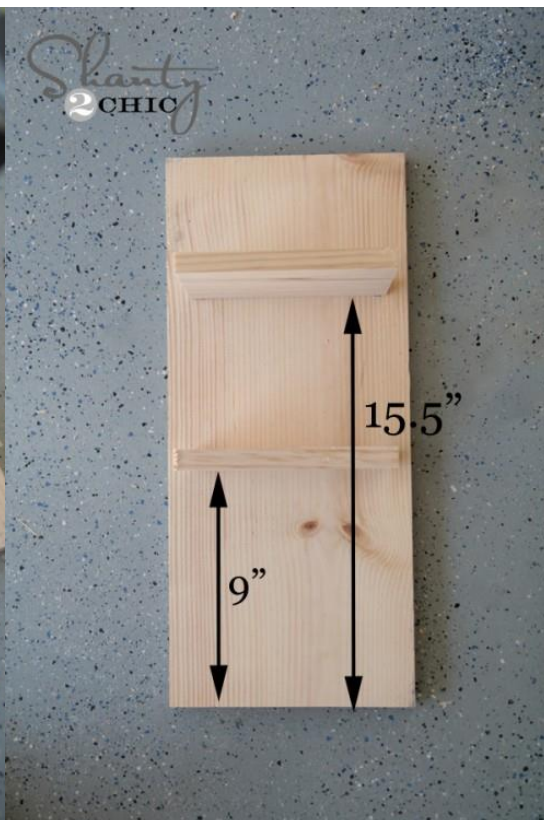
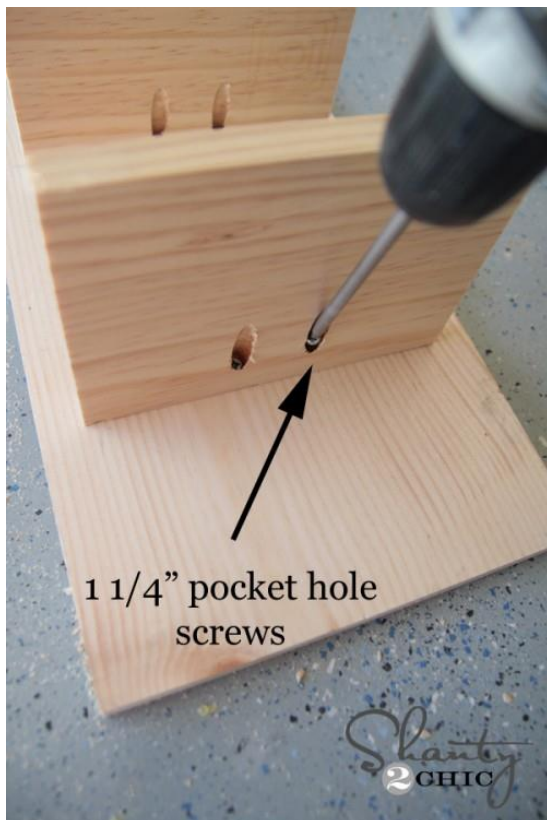
Step 2:

After making all my cuts, I used my **Kreg Jig** to put two 3/4" pocket holes in each of my 1×6 pieces. I put one at each of the arrows.



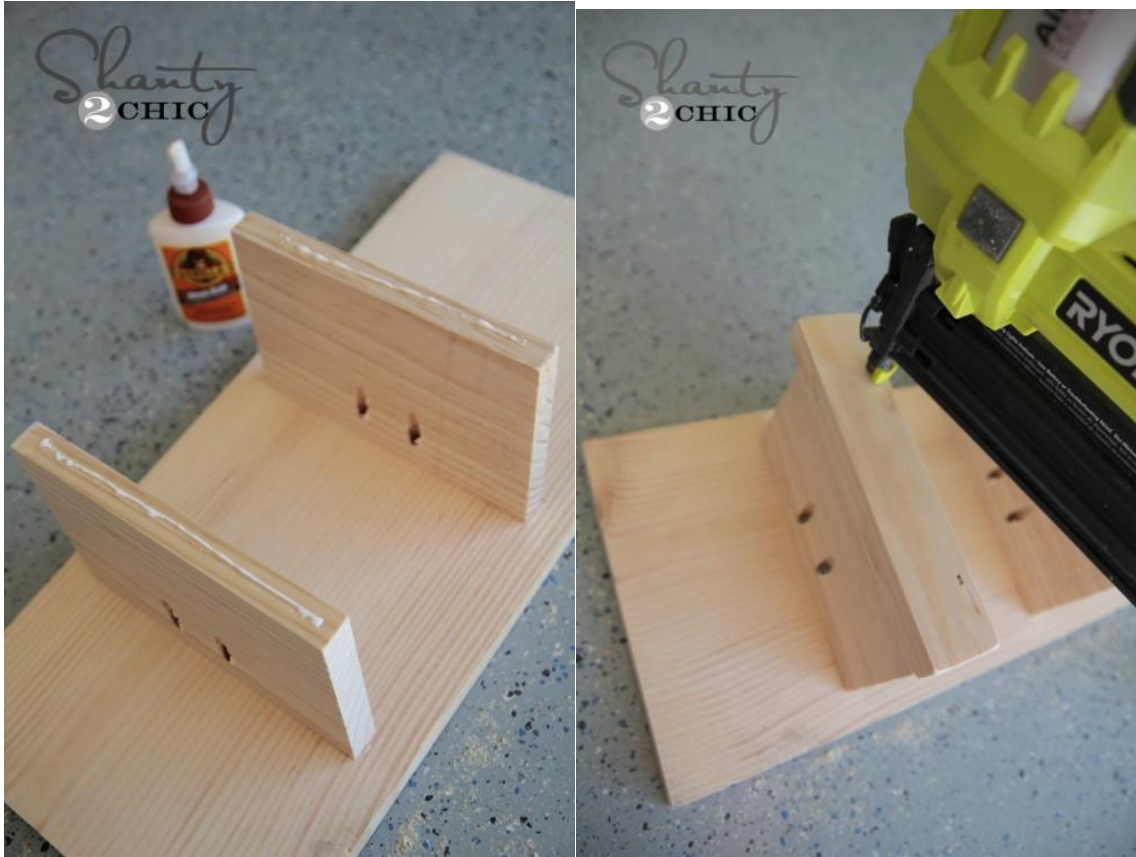
Step 3:

Attach both shelves with pocket screws



Step 4:

Add the front 1×2" trim piece, glue and nail it on.



Step 5:

Now it's time for stain. I applied a dark walnut stain, when dry I roughed it up with a sander on the edges to create a distressed look.
